Certificate IV in Aromatherapy

Aromatherapy is the use of aromatic extracts of plants for healing, relaxation and general improvement of our quality of life, be it at home or in the workplace. The plant extracts and the essential oils used, are volatile substances of great structural complexity. Essential oils play an important role in our lives, and we encounter them every day in perfumes, cosmetics, spices and culinary herbs.

The history of Aromatherapy dates back thousands of years, and aromatic herbs, woods and resins have been used extensively by most cultures through the ages. Only in the last hundred years, with the advances in chemistry, have synthetic fragrances to some extent replaced the use of natural, plant-derived aromas in perfumes and foodstuffs.

Modern Aromatherapy utilises pure, natural essential oils of the highest quality. Individual blends are applied to the body using special massage techniques. Other ways of administering essential oils are in steam inhalations, hand and foot baths, poultices and compresses and evaporating them in oil-burners.

Certificate IV in Aromatherapy - Course Content

This qualification is comprised of 10 common units, 5 specialised units and 2 elective units of competency.

- ▶ Anatomy & Physiology 1B (Systematic) - 24 hours
- ▶ Symptomatology & Pathology for Bodyworkers - 36 hours
- (NB: Students who have completed Symptomatology, Diagnosis & Pathology 1A & 1B do not have to do Symptomatology & Pathology For Bodyworkers.)*
- ▶ Swedish Massage - 42 hours
- ▶ Aromatherapy Studies – An Introduction - 24 hours
- ▶ Aromatherapy Techniques 1 - 24 hours
- ▶ Advanced Aromatherapy - 24 hours
- ▶ Clinical Aromatherapy - 24 hours
- ▶ Communicate With Clients - 24 hours
- (NB: Students who have completed Communication Skills For Health Professionals 1A do not have to do Communicate With Clients).*
- ▶ Business Skills - 21 hours
- ▶ Safe Practices - 12 hours
- ▶ Apply First Aid Certificate - minimum 12 hours
- ▶ Aromatherapy Student Clinic - minimum 50 hours

Visa Requirements

- ▶ Medical Science Review 1A & 1B – International Students - 60 hours
- ▶ Study Skills – International Students - 48 hours
- ▶ Student Clinic Observation Year 1, 2, 3 – International Students - 72 hours

Certificate IV in Aromatherapy

Unit of Study Descriptions & Study Options

Anatomy and Physiology 1A (Regional) (2 hrs/week for 12 weeks OR Distance learning) A fundamental component of all major modalities, this module will teach you about the structure, general function and organisation of the human body.

Anatomy and Physiology 1B (Systematic) (2 hrs/week for 12 weeks OR Distance learning)

This module introduces you to the structure and function of the following body systems: nervous, endocrine, cardiovascular, lymphatic, digestive, respiratory, & genito-urinary.

Pre-requisite: Anatomy & Physiology 1A.

Symptomatology & Pathology for Bodyworkers (3 hrs/week for 12 weeks OR Intensive OR Distance learning)

This unit of study is designed to cover the basic principles of pathology, methods of collecting data on clients, problem-solving, establishing a treatment plan and when to refer a client. Common complaints, illnesses and skin conditions that may be encountered by a bodywork therapist will also be covered in-depth..

Pre-requisites: Anatomy & Physiology 1A & 1B

N.B. Students who have successfully completed Symptomatology, Diagnosis & Pathology 1A & 1B do not have to do Symptomatology & Pathology for Bodyworkers.

Swedish Massage (3.5 hrs/week for 12 weeks OR Intensive)

This module offers a wonderful introduction to the fundamental techniques of massage. You will learn massage routines for the whole body, contra-indications and professional conduct.

Aromatherapy Studies – An Introduction (Intensive OR Distance learning)

Includes the history of Aromatherapy, manufacturing of essential oils, therapeutic properties, blending, etc. Minimum of 30 essential oils are covered in depth.

Aromatherapy Techniques 1 (Intensive)

This course brings the Aromatherapy practice to life by integrating the student's knowledge of massage, anatomy, physiology and aromatherapy. The student learns to combine the unique rhythmic aromatherapy massage techniques with an understanding of essential oils.

Pre-requisites: Aromatherapy Studies – An Introduction, Anatomy & Physiology 1A, Swedish Massage.

Advanced Aromatherapy (Intensive OR Distance learning)

An expansion of Aromatherapy Studies, this module considers the more exotic essential oils, advanced blending techniques, skin type analysis and the many rewarding applications of aromatherapy as a healing discipline.

Pre-requisites: Aromatherapy Studies – An Introduction, Anatomy & Physiology 1A.

Co-requisite: Anatomy & Physiology 1B.

Clinical Aromatherapy (Intensive)

Focuses on the therapeutic use of essential oils in the treatment of conditions affecting the different body systems.

Pre-requisites: Aromatherapy Studies – An Introduction, Swedish Massage, Anatomy & Physiology 1A and 1B.

Co-requisites: Advanced Aromatherapy, Aromatherapy Techniques 1.

Communicate With Clients (2 hrs/week for 12 weeks OR Intensive)

This module covers the skills required by practitioners to establish and maintain effective communication with the client throughout all interactions and provide basic counselling as required and as appropriate to facilitate the treatment or health service being provided.

Business Skills (Intensive)

This unit of study will prepare you for working in a clinical health setting by providing you with the knowledge and skills required to administer a practice. You will also learn how to make referrals to other health care professionals and community services when appropriate, develop your networking skills, comply with statutory obligations and maintain ethical work practices.

Safe Practices (Workshop OR Distance Learning)

This workshop incorporates two topics: Infection Control in Alternative Health Clinics and Occupational, Health and Safety (OHS). This unit incorporates the skills and knowledge required to comply with infection control policies and procedures and contribute to OHS processes.

Apply First Aid Certificate

It is a requirement of the course that students hold a current first aid certificate at graduation.

Aromatherapy Student Clinic

Total requirement: 50 hours.

Pre-requisites: Aromatherapy Studies – An Introduction, Advanced Aromatherapy, Aromatherapy Techniques 1, Swedish Massage, Safe Practices, and Anatomy & Physiology 1A and 1B.

Visa Compliance Requirements – Additional Units of Study

Medical Science Review 1A – International Student

In this unit of study, students are introduced to medical terminologies, mathematical concepts and basic chemistry to assist in their current and future studies. On line workshops will be used to assist in knowledge and visualisation of body systems and muscles. A series of DVDs are presented with learning activities to assess skills and knowledge.

Medical Science Review 1B – International Student

In this unit of study, students will expand on their knowledge of the human body systems. Each body system will be studied in detail with DVD and online resources to assist in the knowledge and skills acquired.

Teaching Methods

A range of teaching methods are incorporated for delivery of course content as relevant to the subject. These include a combination of modified lectures utilizing visual aids, workbooks and handouts, class and group discussions, theory and practical exercises, demonstrations, role plays and presentations.

Assessment

All courses are assessed through a variety of assessments eg practical and written examinations, assignments, class presentations, role plays etc. Individual subject outlines detailing the timing and assessment methods and weighting will be given out in your first week of class for each subject. Pre-requisites: Aromatherapy Studies - An Introduction , Swedish Massage, Aromatherapy Techniques 1, Anatomy & Physiology 1A&B, Safe Practices & Communicate with Clients.

When completing the Certificate IV in Aromatherapy, students may also attain the Certificate IV in Massage if they complete Remedial Massage 1 & 2 plus an additional 70 hours of Remedial Massage Student Clinic.

Nominal Hours and Duration of Course

The nominal hours for the international version of the Certificate IV in Aromatherapy is 521 hours. The duration of this course is a total of 2 terms equal to 24 weeks of term class contact and 4 weeks of holidays and mid term breaks, making a total of 28 weeks.
