Diploma of Aromatherapy

Aromatherapy is the use of aromatic extracts of plants for healing, relaxation and general improvement of our quality of life, be it at home or in the work place. The plant extracts used, the essential oils, are volatile substances of great structural complexity. Essential oils play an important role in our lives, and we encounter them every day in perfumes, cosmetics, spices and culinary herbs.

The history of Aromatherapy dates back thousands of years, and aromatic herbs, woods and resins have been used extensively by most cultures through the ages. Only in the last hundred years, with the advances in chemistry, have synthetic fragrances to some extent replaced the use of natural, plant-derived aromas in perfumes and foodstuffs.

Modern Aromatherapy utilises pure, natural essential oils of the highest quality. Individual blends are applied to the body using special massage techniques. Other ways of administering essential oils are in steam inhalations, hand and foot baths, poultices and compresses and evaporating them in oil-burners.

Diploma of Aromatherapy Module Descriptions & Study Options

Anatomy and Physiology 1A (Regional) (2 hours a week for 12 weeks OR Distance learning)

This module teaches the structure, general function and organisation of the human body with a thorough look at the musculoskeletal system. *Free tutorials available*

Anatomy and Physiology 1B (Systematic) (2 hours/week for 12 weeks OR Distance learning)

This module introduces you to the structure and function of the following body systems: nervous, endocrine, cardiovascular, lymphatic, digestive, respiratory and genito-urinary. *Free tutorials available*
Pre-requisite: Anatomy & Physiology 1A.

Anatomy and Physiology 1C (Applied) (2 hours a week for 12 weeks OR Distance learning)

This module integrates your knowledge of Anatomy & Physiology 1A & 1B, increasing your understanding of a wide range of body functions. Subjects studied include the anatomy and physiology of stress, sleep, consciousness, memory, emotions and behaviour.
Pre-requisites: Anatomy & Physiology 1A & 1B

Symptomatology & Pathology for Bodyworkers (3 hrs/week for 12 weeks OR D/L)

This module is designed to cover the basic principles of pathology, methods of collecting data on clients, problem-solving, establishing a treatment plan and when to refer a client. Common complaints, illnesses and skin conditions that may be encountered by a bodywork therapist will also be covered in depth.
Pre-requisites: Anatomy & Physiology 1A, 1B

Note: Students who have completed the modules 'Symptomatology, Diagnosis & Pathology 1A, 1B & 1C' do not have to do 'Symptomatology & Pathology for Bodyworkers'.

Swedish Massage (3.5 hours a week for 12 weeks OR Intensive)

This module offers a wonderful introduction to the fundamental techniques of massage. You will learn massage routines for the whole body, contra-indications and professional conduct.

Aromatherapy Studies – An Introduction (2 hours a week for 12 weeks OR Distance learning)

Includes the history of Aromatherapy, manufacturing of essential oils, therapeutic properties, blending, etc. Minimum of 30 essential oils are covered in depth. This course is a pre-requisite for all other Aromatherapy subjects.

Aromatherapy Techniques 1 (2 hours a week for 12 weeks)

This course brings the Aromatherapy practice to life by integrating the student's knowledge of massage, anatomy, physiology and aromatherapy. The student learns to combine the unique rhythmic aromatherapy massage techniques with an understanding of essential oils.

Pre-requisites: Aromatherapy Studies - An Intro, A & P 1A, Swedish Massage

Aromatherapy Techniques 2 (2 hours a week for 12 weeks)

The techniques acquired in Aromatherapy Techniques 1 are developed further. It also includes massage in pregnancy, poultices and compresses, skin care and masks, cellulite treatment and infant massage.

Pre-requisites: Aromatherapy Studies - An Introduction, Anatomy & Physiology 1A, 1B, Swedish Massage

Advanced Aromatherapy (2 hours a week for 12 weeks OR Distance learning)

An expansion of Aromatherapy Studies, this module considers the more exotic essential oils, advanced blending techniques, skin type analysis and the many rewarding applications of aromatherapy as a healing discipline.

Pre-requisites: Aromatherapy Studies - An Introduction, Anatomy & Physiology 1A,

Co-requisite: Anatomy & Physiology 1B

Chemistry & Pharmacology of Essential Oils (2 hrs/week for 12 weeks OR Distance learning)

This module will give you a working knowledge of basic organic chemistry, focussing on the study of essential oil constituents, including the nature and properties of various functional groups which are found in essential oil molecules, as well as the absorption, metabolism and therapeutic/toxic effect of essential oils in humans.

Pre-requisites: Aromatherapy Studies - An Introduction, Anatomy & Physiology 1A

Co-requisite: Anatomy & Physiology 1B

NB: Students who have completed Chemistry & Herbal Medicine 2B (Pharmacognosy) do not need to do Chemistry & Pharmacology of Essential Oils.

Clinical Aromatherapy (2 hours a week for 12 weeks OR Intensive)

Focuses on the therapeutic use of Aromatherapy in the treatment of conditions affecting the different body systems.

Pre-requisites: Aromatherapy Studies - An Introduction, Anatomy & Physiology 1A & 1B, Swedish Massage.

Co-requisites: Advanced Aromatherapy, Aromatherapy Techniques 1

Aromatherapy For Complex Needs (Intensive)

Aromatherapy has many clinical applications within both holistic and orthodox medicine. Guest speakers will discuss the use of Aromatherapy within their specialised areas of expertise. Topics covered will include geriatric care, oncology, palliative care, wound healing, as well as issues relating to emotional and mental health. Blending of appropriate therapeutic oils will be discussed. A range of complementary health modalities will be identified, analysed and evaluated.

Pre-requisites: Aromatherapy Studies – An Introduction, Swedish Massage, Anatomy & Physiology 1A & 1B.

Business Skills

This module introduces students to basic business skills. Covered are issues of referrals, bookkeeping requirements for a practice and working with colleagues for the resolution of a treatment plan for the client.

Diploma of Aromatherapy Module Descriptions & Study Options

Communicate With Clients (*Intensive*)

This module covers the skills required by practitioners to establish and maintain effective communication with the client throughout all interactions and provide basic counselling as required and as appropriate to facilitate the treatment or health service being provided.

Safe Practices (*Workshop*)

This workshop incorporates two topics: Infection Control in Alternative Health Clinics and Occupational, Health and Safety (OHS). This unit incorporates the skills and knowledge required to comply with infection control policies and procedures and contribute to OHS processes.

Develop Professional Expertise

In this module the budding practitioner will develop skills on managing a practice. You will learn how to find the latest information on research in the field of complementary medicine and to implement this knowledge in practice. An important part of this module is writing a business plan

Clinical Supervision – Tactile

This module supports students in the facilitation of effective communication in relation to clinical practice and the health sector.

Pre-Requisite – Certificate IV level Student Clinic

Co-Requisite - Student clinic

Apply First Aid Certificate

It is a requirement of the course that students hold a current First Aid certificate at graduation.

Student Clinic

Total requirement: 80 hours.

Pre-requisites: Aromatherapy Studies - An Introduction, Advanced Aromatherapy, Aromatherapy Techniques 1, Swedish Massage, Safe Practices, Anatomy & Physiology 1A and 1B.
